#### **W** Butterfly House

BGO is home to Arkansas' only Butterfly House, where guests can observe native butterflies from May to October. As the centerpiece of our annual Butterfly Camp, the space gives students a unique chance to study pollinators and their crucial role in the ecosystem.

#### Vegetable Garden

With support from the Urban Agriculture Resilience Program, awarded by the U.S. Botanic Garden and American Public Gardens Association. BGO has introduced raised beds to the Vegetable Garden to enhance accessibility and boost yield. Each year, this garden produces over a ton of fresh, organic produce for our Northwest Arkansas neighbors in need.
